RE: Situation Report #2 on Flooding

County Emergency Managers across northwest Wisconsin continue assessing the damage from heavy rains and flooding that occurred on 6/19 and 6/20. And in Clark County, a road washout claimed three lives early this morning (6/21). Here is a summary:

Ashland County: County Emergency Manager reports that several municipalities are affected by flooding and will be declaring a state of emergency. Road closures include State Hwy 169 and County Road N.

Bayfield County:

Six townships and the Tribal Lands of the Red Cliff Band of Lake Superior Chippewa report flood damage to roads. The county has submitted a Uniform Disaster Situation Report.

Clark County:

At approximately 1:35am this morning, three people were killed after two vehicles crash into an area where the road appeared to have washed out by heavy rains. The Clark County Sheriff's Department reports finding two vehicles in the wash out on County Road M approximately one and a half miles north of County Road I, just east of Augusta. The victims have been identified as Thomas Jurceka, 56 and Susan Jurceka, 57, both of Milwaukee and Mary Malinowski, 24, from Thorp. Note: *This occurred Thursday after the flooding in Douglas and Bayfield Counties.*

Douglas County:

Flood waters affected 75 homes. Damage estimates to each home range from \$2000 to \$40,000. Officials are now checking on what damage is covered by insurance. Twenty five roads are closed with some still covered by water. Therefore there is no damage estimate at this time. One temporary shelter was deactivated at 5pm yesterday after no residents reported. Flood Warnings continue for Douglas County. The City of Superior and Douglas County continue to operate under a state of emergency.

Wisconsin Emergency Management continues to be engaged with the local officials; however no assistance has been requested of the State so far. Wisconsin Emergency Management will continue to monitor and provide updates for this ongoing event.
